## Keynote Speakers



**GE Ghali, DDS, MD, FACS, FRCS(Ed)**  
Professor and Chairman,  
LSU Health Shreveport  
Shreveport, Louisiana

Dr. Ghali has lived and practiced in Shreveport for the past 24 years. He and his wife, Hope, have four children. Dr. Ghali's practice spans from primary cleft repair to cosmetic surgery to head and neck cancer. His professional interest lies in the treatment of pediatric craniofacial deformities including craniosynostosis, cleft lip and palate, and dentofacial deformities. However, his surgical and teaching interests also include dentoalveolar surgery, dental implants, cosmetic surgery, head and neck oncology, and trauma. Dr. Ghali has served as the Professor and Chairman of the Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Department for the past 14 years. In October 2016, he was named Chancellor and Dean of the Health Sciences Center. He subsequently relinquished the role of Dean to focus on negotiations for a new hospital partner resulting in a joint venture with Ochsner Health System effective Oct. 1, 2018. He is very active in resident, fellow, and student education with appointments to numerous committees keeping LSU Health Shreveport at the forefront of medical care and education in Louisiana. Dr. Ghali has continued to serve on national and international organizations such as AAOMS, ABOMS, and IAOMS. Dr. Ghali's association with these organizations is recognized in shaping the profession of oral and maxillofacial surgery, as well as providing international recognition for the LSU Health Shreveport residency and fellowship programs. Dr. Ghali has numerous research interests including clinical and basic science research. He has published in numerous peer-reviewed journals, written many book chapters and has edited textbooks that are vital to the knowledge base of many in the specialty.



**Warner L. Thomas, MBA, ACHE**  
President and CEO  
Ochsner Health System Louisiana

As President and CEO of Louisiana's largest non-profit, academic healthcare system, Warner Thomas is responsible for Ochsner Health System's overall strategic growth and development. He spearheaded innovation at Ochsner to create future health innovations to revolutionize patient-centered care. In 2014, his expertise was nationally recognized through his appointment to advise Congress on the Medicare Payment Advisory Commission.

## Overview

The mission of the AACMFS is to improve the health and quality of life of patients with congenital and acquired CMF disorders by the advancement of knowledge of the science and art of CMF surgery. Fellows of the Academy will present their selected abstracts on current research and innovations in practice in the areas of:

1. pediatrics, craniomaxillofacial and orthognathic surgery,
2. trauma,
3. head and neck oncology,
4. reconstruction and
5. education, training and research.

The goal of this activity is to bring together experts in their respective fields to share scientific studies, technological advancements and clinical outcomes, and ultimately to improve care for patients with craniomaxillofacial pathologies.

## Target Audience

The Scientific Annual Meeting is for oral and maxillofacial surgeons who are Fellows of the AACMFS, who have come together to advance their field of practice and are interested in sharing experiences and setting future direction. Fellows and residents in related specialties may be invited by Academy members to present abstracts, and participate in the scientific meeting.

## Professional Practice Gaps

The Annual Scientific Meeting serves to bridge the gaps in knowledge and competence/skills, due to ongoing advances in oral maxillofacial surgery (OMS). Innovations in areas such as biotechnology and immunology, robotics, devices and instrumentation, and health informatics demand that clinicians stay abreast of improvements, to assess the potential impact on care and integrate appropriately. Fellows of the Academy are also involved in developing and teaching in OMS Residency Programs, as well as subspecialty Fellowships. Exploring topics in education, training and research addresses the gap in knowledge and strategy, to facilitate progress and growth in those academic areas.

## Assessment of Need

Surgeons need knowledge updates and innovative clinical strategies for managing patients with oral maxillofacial disorders. The presentation and discussion of scientific and clinical studies addresses the need to assess technological advancements and outcomes, with a goal to potentially improve aspects of practice.

## Methodology-Format

This course is structured to be highly interactive, where Academy members and their selected residents/fellows, present a five-minute abstract, followed by a ten-minute discussion period. The audience participates in the collegial debate and thoughtful assessment of the study. Keynote speakers will also present lectures with discussion sessions. Abstracts are printed in the meeting syllabus.

## Objectives

Upon completion of this scientific session the physician should be able to:

1. Assess research abstracts and studies as they relate to craniomaxillofacial patient populations, pathology and treatment options, and the implications for changes in practice.
2. Discuss advancements in biologics and technology, and appropriate utilization.
3. Evaluate potential academic and curricular modifications to enhance knowledge, competency and improve relevancy.
4. Examine contemporary interdisciplinary and cross-functional patient care delivery models with respect to your clinical setting.
5. Identify evolving aspects of care and technologies within oral maxillofacial surgery, which impact patient care, education, and a need for unique surgeon leadership.
6. Discuss management strategies and innovative partnerships that can revolutionize and improve healthcare delivery.

A 500-word limit for abstracts that includes:

- Concise title of the clinical study or research (abstract)
- Indicate for which one of the five specialty sections the paper is being submitted (see list below)
- List of all authors with academic/professional credentials
- Academic and/or Clinical Institution name which supported/participated in the study
- Presenter name & credentials\*
- Headings as relevant:
  - » Purpose
  - » Materials and Methods
  - » Results and Conclusions

Abstracts may focus on basic/scientific, translational or clinical aspects of care, including case reports which would likely elicit robust discussion. Each abstract presentation will be no more than 5 minutes in length, followed by an allotted time for discussion. Upon acceptance, authors will be notified of final presentation and discussion date/time.

Abstracts will be considered for the following sections:

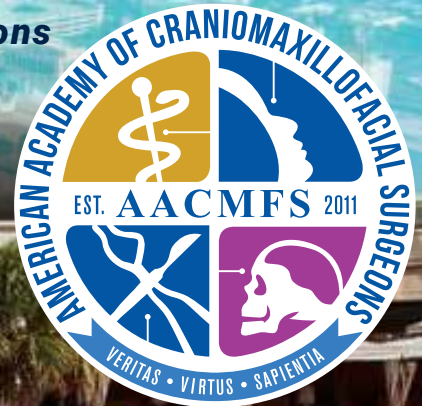
1. Pediatrics, Craniofacial and Orthognathic Surgery
